What is a School Food Center?

Provide no-cost grocery items to students and their families while creating a positive culture around food. It can be set up much like a store, offering a wide variety of choice. Schools can adapt the program to best fit their unique needs.

THE BENEFITS



Students have opportunities to build skills in ordering, inventory, budgeting, marketing, and more.



Schools order the food that meets the needs of their students and families.



Students and families have increased and convenient access to nutritious food.

What does the school provide?

- A site coordinator and back-up coordinator who signs an agreement with the Food Bank, participates in an orientation, manages orders, deliveries, and inventory.
- A designated space to house the program.
 Consider this program as a part of wraparound service offerings. FBST visits bi-annually to ensure compliance and food safety.
